SEPTEMBER

- **PSO Info Night** A time to learn more about our parent service organization, leadership opportunities within the parent community and a showcase of different committees that are parent led.
- **Curriculum Night** This is a parent only event in which an overview of the curriculum taught at Great Heart is reviewed. There will be an opportunity for parents to ask questions and complete sample classwork.
- The Big Give Part of the South Central Texas 24 hours Big Give that helps raise money for local non profit organizations.

OCTOBER

- Book Fair This is an opportunity that occurs twice a year where students get to purchase carefully selected books on campus from a local book store.
- Parent/Teacher Conferences This is a parent/teacher only meeting where your students current classroom performance is discussed in detail in an in person meeting.

NOVEMBER

- Athletic Field Day Students in Kindergarten-5th grade will compete against one another in athletic events while representing a Greek city state or their house.
- Literary Character Day Students may dress up as any character from any book on the K-8 Classics to Keep List, a grade-level read-aloud book, Greek or Roman Mythology or a historical character from our curriculum at Western Hills and come to school primed for a joyful day filled with reading.
- Grandparents Day Our Spartan Grandparents are invited to join us on campus where attendees
 can expect refreshments, a welcome from our Headmaster, photos with "grand-scholars," and a
 chance to see inside their classrooms.

DECEMBER

- Winter Concert An opportunity for students to showcase their musical accomplishments and perform in a group ensemble giving families an opportunity to appreciate the beauty and complexity of a timeless artform. This after school and off campus event is required for all students.
- **Spelling Bee** A spelling competition that takes place in each homeroom classroom which is a prequalifier for a school and district wide bee.
- **Spirit Week** Spirit week coincides with the 5 days of giving where students dress up or accessorize based on different themes for each day.

JANUARY

• **Independent Study project** – A research project that every student is required to complete. Each project comprises of researching a topic assigned by the teacher, a written report, a presentation and in some grade levels the creation of a student made artifact or the option to dress up.

FEBRUARY

Parent Open House – An event where parents of currently enrolled students have the opportunity to
observe and sit in various classes throughout their students school day.

MARCH

- Great Hearts Day Also known as Friendship day is a day that students celebrate the virtue of friendship and bring in a homemade item to share with a peer.
- **Book Fair** This is an opportunity that occurs twice a year where students get to purchase carefully selected books on campus from a local book store.
- Read-A-Thon Grade level competition to see which students and which homeroom classroom reads
 the most minutes in a two week period.

APRIL

- Academic Field Day 5th graders will compete against one another in academic themed events while representing their house.
- **Spring Concert –** An opportunity for students to showcase their musical accomplishments and perform in a group ensemble giving families an opportunity to appreciate the beauty and complexity of a timeless artform. This after school and off campus event is required for all students.
- **STAAR exams –** State mandated standardized testing.
- PSO Fiesta Annual school wide fundraiser that is Fiesta themed and run by the parent service organization (PSO). This is a weekend event that consists of rides, activity booths for kids, food and tons of fun for our students.

MAY

- PSO volunteer appreciation breakfast a breakfast hosted by the campus leadership team and faculty to thank parents who volunteered their time throughout the school year.
- Kindergarten and 5th promotions Promotion ceremonies for current kindergarten and 5th graders to celebrate the years accomplishments and to send them off to the next milestone in their school journey.
