Great Hearts Western Hills will involve parents in the development of the Title I plan and the process of school review and improvement (Campus Improvement Plan).

An adequate number of parents will work collaboratively with the Title I Committee in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review and improvement of the Title I program.

Parents will be provided with opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions, share experiences with other parents, and to participate in decisions relating to the education of their children (Title I Committee, AAC, District Board Meetings, and Student/Parent Surveys).

Parents will receive a timely response to their suggestions.

The school will coordinate, provide technical assistance, and other support necessary to assist parents in actively participating in the planning and implementing of a parent involvement program (Title I committee, AAC, Parent Service Org, College Counselor).

Parents will jointly conduct an evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parental involvement policy and revise as necessary (Fall and Spring Academy Advisory Committee Meetings, PSO, Parent Surveys, Title I Committee).
